PROJECT DESCRIPTION	<p>The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) contracted with Chemonics International and hereinafter Chemonics Egypt to provide the monitoring, verification, and evaluation component of the Egyptian Environmental Policy Program (EEPP) through a Monitoring, Verification, and Evaluation (MVE) Unit. The EEPP is intended to assist the Government of Egypt (GOE) in achieving policy objectives in the following areas: selected cross-cutting constraints in the environment sector; cleaner and more efficient energy use; reduced industrial pollution; improved solid waste management; and natural resources management. Chemonics International subcontracted with Chemonics Egypt for technical assistance services necessary to implement this program.</p> <p>Chemonics Egypt provided qualified short-term consultants, specifically to provide ongoing support to the Chemonics International – led MVE unit component of the Egyptian Environmental Policy Program (EEPP). This support included review of environmental management policies, energy conservation and air pollution prevention, and monitoring environmental impacts of wastewater management, industrial pollution, and coastal zone management.</p>
